President's Message

As I prepare to conclude my tenure as President of Newry Chamber of Commerce & Trade, I find myself reflecting on two years that have been both transformative for this region and deeply meaningful for me personally. When I first accepted the chain of office in

November 2023, I spoke about what it meant to 'put on the jersey' the responsibility to serve, the privilege of representing this business community and the commitment required to advance the long-term prosperity of the Greater Newry Area.

Standing now at the end of that journey, I feel the weight of those responsibilities in a different way not as pressure, but as perspective. The past two years have shown me the depth of ambition, resilience and unity that define this region. They have also made clear that progress is not accidental; it is built through collaboration, persistence and a shared belief in what Newry can become.

This final report is not simply a summary of activities. It is a record of a region that refuses to be left behind, a community that continues to push forward despite challenges and a Chamber that has strengthened its voice, widened its influence and deepened its impact. When I reflect on the work, we set out to do connecting our members, championing essential infrastructure and supporting the people who make up our workforce I am proud of what has been achieved. I am equally proud of how it has been achieved through integrity, cooperation and an unwavering commitment to the future of the Greater Newry Area.

A Year of Progress & Purpose

The pace of change and the demands placed upon our businesses over the last 12 months have been significant. Yet, what has remained constant is the determination of this community to adapt, innovate and invest.

This year has seen the Chamber deepen its strategic engagement with Ministers at Stormont, senior officials at Westminster and policymakers in Dublin. We have strengthened our alliances with partner Chambers across the island, collaborated with education and training providers and continued to elevate the profile of the Greater Newry Area locally, regionally and internationally.

The work has not been abstract. It has delivered meaningful progress for businesses, for employers, for workers and for the wider community. The following sections capture the substance of that work and the momentum now in place for the years ahead.

Strengthening Our Strategic Priorities

From the beginning of my presidency, three priorities guided our agenda:

1) Cultivating Connection

2) Championing the Infrastructure Required for Growth

3) Strengthening Talent Pathways & Supporting People

This year saw tangible movement in all three priorities.

1) Cultivating Connection

Connection is one of the great strengths of this Chamber. It is what enables businesses to collaborate, share experience, build resilience and create new opportunities. This year we continued to build a genuinely inclusive and engaged business community.

Our membership now stands close to 325 businesses, supported by 43 Corporate Patrons a strong and growing endorsement of the Chamber's value and direction. Across our social platforms, we now reach upwards of 22,000 followers, extending our influence and amplifying the voice of the business community.

The Chamber's events programme has been both diverse and impactful. Throughout the year we hosted policy breakfasts, sector forums, business roundtables, leadership events and key networking opportunities. Our International Women's Day and International Men's Day events showcased the depth of talent and inclusivity in this region, while our Business Awards, with over 200 entries and 450 attendees, once again highlighted the innovation, ambition and entrepreneurial spirit of our members. A particular highlight was our first eCommerce Conference a significant milestone in our ambition to position Newry as an eCommerce Trading Hub on the island of Ireland. This work aligns strongly with local strength in logistics, fulfilment and cross-border digital trade.

From small businesses to large employers, the connection within this Chamber continues to be a powerful force - one that fosters partnership, facilitates collaboration and generates real economic activity.

2) Championing the Infrastructure Required for Growth

Infrastructure remains the critical foundation for the region's long-term prosperity. The Chamber continued to lobby vigorously for investment in transport links, digital connectivity and wastewater capacity all of which are essential to future development and growth.

This year brought a major breakthrough. Our consistent engagement with the Minister for Infrastructure resulted in the announcement of a pilot scheme for wastewater infrastructure in Newry, a transformative commitment that will unlock development for the next five years. This was a significant achievement for the Chamber and a testament to the collective strength of business advocacy when grounded in clear evidence and united purpose.

We also engaged directly with Ministers at Stormont and with counterparts in the UK Government on the key pressures facing our region, including the rising costs of doing business and the urgent need for support schemes to mitigate the impact on local companies.

Our representation extended to Westminster, where we hosted senior officials from the Bank of England, The House of Lords Windsor Framework Scrutiny Committee and The Migration Advisory Committee. These engagements ensured that the concerns and priorities of Greater Newry employers were heard at the highest levels.

We also strengthened our cross-border collaboration. Our work with Dundalk Chamber and other partners on the M1 Corridor continues to set the groundwork for long-term cross-border competitiveness, particularly in skills, labour mobility and regional development.

Internationally, we re-ignited Newry's historic relationship with Pittsburgh, supporting the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding between Southern Regional College and Catalyst Connection an important step in fostering collaboration in advanced manufacturing, skills and innovation.

Our advocacy for enhanced digital infrastructure also progressed significantly. Working with BT, we have made a robust case for major investment in 5G and wider digital connectivity for the district - key enablers for automation, eCommerce, life sciences, tech and advanced manufacturing. The Chamber also played a key role in the establishment and early development of the Local Economic Partnership (LEP), which will invest £4.5 million across the district between now and 2028 supporting local economic development, skills and regeneration initiatives. These are not abstract wins. They are foundational to the future we are building.

3) Strengthening Talent Pathways & Supporting People

People remain at the heart of our region's success. This year the Chamber intensified its work to support talent development, skills programmes and inclusive pathways into employment. We collaborated closely with the Labour Market Partnership, working with employers, training providers and educational institutions to address workforce challenges, strengthen recruitment pipelines and develop a more coordinated skills strategy.

We continued to support programmes that create opportunities for those with additional needs, women returning to work and individuals rebuilding their lives. Our work with Women's Aid Armagh Down has been particularly meaningful not only has the Chamber raised substantial funds, but it has provided a platform to highlight the importance of safety, empowerment and opportunity for women and families in crisis.

Our events this year emphasised representation and inclusion. Speakers such as Kate Grant and Maeve Robb demonstrated the power of visibility in leadership and the importance of ensuring every individual feels they belong in the economic life of this region. In all of this, the message is clear: inclusive growth is sustainable growth.

Taking Newry to Bigger Stages

Our engagement beyond the region continued to strengthen. In 2024, we supported InterTradelreland's 25th Anniversary in Washington, D.C., participating in thirteen high-level events over four days and engaging with the First and deputy First Ministers, the Economy Minister and the US Economic Envoy, Joe Kennedy III. This visit from US Economic Envoy elevated Newry's profile internationally and deepened relationships that will support future investment, trade and collaboration.

We also engaged with senior Irish Government officials, including the Shared Island Unit to explore cross-border funding models that could support major infrastructure priorities for the region.

Our presence at events such as the St. Patrick's Day Reception at Downing Street allowed us to highlight the need for sustained investment in Northern Ireland's infrastructure and economy at the highest levels of the UK Government.

These opportunities are more than symbolic they influence decisions that shape the future of this region.

Leadership, Succession & Governance

This year, the Chamber continued its work on Board restructuring and succession planning ensuring strong governance and a sustainable leadership pipeline. We have worked tirelessly to strengthen the Board's structure so that it reflects the growth of the organisation, the diversity of our membership and the needs of the region.

At this AGM, we say farewell to several Board members whose commitment, expertise and service have shaped the Chamber's work over many years. Their contribution has been deeply appreciated.

At the same time, we are pleased to welcome new Board members who bring fresh energy, new ideas and important sectoral perspectives. We also welcome new members to the Chamber Council, whose role continues to be vital in providing insight, challenge and connection across the wider business community.

This blend of continuity and renewal ensures that the Chamber remains strong, balanced and future focused.

CEO's Message

The last 12 months has seen many challenges for the business community of Greater Newry with the cost of doing business continuing to increase, and the Northern Ireland Executive struggling with a fiscal crisis that shows no signs of abating.

While many local employers speak about uncertainty and a challenging economic climate, most of those that we have engaged with throughout 2025 remain optimistic and determined to make the most of the potential opportunities coming our way in this corner of the island.

Last year, in my message to members, I stated that I believe Greater Newry stands on the threshold of a 'Decade of Opportunity' and Newry Chamber's engagement with businesses, Government Departments from across these islands, and many strategists and academics since then, has consolidated that view.

Newry Chamber has played its part in inspiring confidence in our stakeholders, and we will continue to seek out and deliver on opportunities to grow our local economy through a strong collaborative and collegiate approach.

Our Three Strategic Pillar focused approach has been central to our success over the last year.

The Three Strategic Pillars are:

1) Cultivating Connection

Continuing to develop Newry Chamber into one of the largest business organisations in NI with an active and engaged membership base

2) Championing the Infrastructure Required for Growth

Leading the lobby to address the infrastructure deficit to unlock the Greater Newry Area's development and investment potential

3) Strengthening Talent Pathways & Supporting People

Bringing businesses, education and training providers together to develop a localised strategy to tackle the region's skills and recruitment challenges

We are building a strong business voice that is positive and persuasive on the lobbying circuit across these islands and beyond, and the Chamber Team and Board have worked tirelessly throughout 2025 to ensure our membership and engagement opportunities continue to grow at pace.

Newry Chamber continues to flourish with membership growing year on year by 14%, we now have 43 Corporate Patrons, and our packed events programme has attracted strong attendances and sponsorship revenues have grown by over 33% year on year.

The Chamber's profile has never been higher with our social media reach continuing to outstrip other regional chambers across NI with our platforms now attracting 22,075 followers, up from 20,560 an increase of 7% year on year.

Our financial position is stronger than ever, and 2025 will see the organisation return to a profitable position after a two-year period of financial consolidation. Our bank position is healthy and stable.

Newry Chamber is now firmly established as an effective 21st Century business organisation with a dynamic and positive outlook, earning respect in the corridors of power in Stormont, Westminster, Dublin and the USA.

Lobbying has become a central plank of Newry Chamber's Modus Operandi over the last two years, and as Chief Executive, working alongside our outgoing President Edwina Flynn and our Board Members, we have used our voice to positive effect, delivering on the need to improve our wastewater infrastructure, creating a positive physical and fiscal environment for economic growth, and bringing employers, education and training providers, policymakers and young people together to develop a Skills and Recruitment Strategy that will support our economy over the coming decades.

Many challenges remain, particularly around business costs, delivery of sustainable infrastructure and attracting talent, but with strong leadership and unity of purpose, these and other obstacles can be overcome, and our region can fulfil its potential as a vibrant, young city which can become the beating heart of the Dublin-Belfast Economic Corridor.

The Windsor Framework presents Newry with a unique opportunity to position itself as the 'Gateway City' to both the UK and EU Markets and Newry Chamber continues to promote the Dual Market Access (DMA) opportunities that our region has to offer. We held a successful and well attended DMA event in partnership with Invest NI on February 20th and we have engaged with partner businesses and organisations in ROI and Pittsburgh and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, USA; who are interested in Newry as a location from which to grow their market reach.

The 'T' Word has been on everyone's lips throughout 2025 and while 'Tariffs' are problematic for global trade, they have presented Greater Newry with an additional dimension to our trading opportunities. With a 5% differential in US tariffs between the UK and Europe, Newry's location on the UK side of the Irish Border has led to Irish companies looking to our city as a potential location for expansion to facilitate easier and cheaper access to markets in the UK, Europe and the United States.

In March I travelled to Pittsburgh to engage with businesses, economic development officials and education and training providers with a view to reinvigorating the Newry-Pittsburgh Partnership which was established by the late Dan Rooney and Sir Anthony O'Reilly back in the early 1990s.

The relationship had become dormant over the last decade as Dan's health declined before his death in 2017. The trip was a positive one with contacts made at key levels and this resulted in a delegation from Pittsburgh travelling to Newry in September during game week ahead of the Pittsburgh Steelers game at Croke Park on September 28th.

Dan Rooney, grandson of Dan travelled to Newry and announced a scholarship programme with St Mary's HS and Newry High School in the city and Southern Regional College signed a memorandum of understanding with Pittsburgh innovation centre Catalyst Connection, which I visited in March. Significant progress has been made in re-establishing connections with our friends in the United States with businesses keen to look at Newry as partner destination given the DMA and Tariff opportunities we offer. Work will continue to build those connections in 2026.

Our sincere thanks to Jim Lamb, Honorary Irish Consul in Pittsburgh and Declan Barry, Trade & Investment Representative for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for connecting us with the business community in the US, and Fergal McCormack for his kind assistance in reconnecting the Chamber with the Rooney Family and the Steelers.

The opportunities flowing from Dual Market Access and Tariff Differentials are live and can be a gamechanger for this region, but they also have the potential to pass us by if we do not create a positive investment environment across our region – we need to build momentum.

We have faced a significant impediment to economic expansion and development in our region due to a lack of capacity in our wastewater system. Many developments have remained at a standstill due to wastewater capacity restrictions being applied to planning applications and this is a huge stumbling block to development across Greater Newry.

The NI Executive is cash-strapped and as a result collaboration and innovative thinking are the only options available to us at present to deliver on elements of our wastewater needs.

In May 2025, Newry Chamber Corporate Patrons, Board Members and staff met with Infrastructure Minister Liz Kimmins and Economy Minister Caoimhe Archibald to outline the dire situation we face in this region due to wastewater capacity. Both Ministers listened and Minister Kimmins agreed on the need to come up with innovative and collaborative solutions. Within a matter of months Newry was announced as the location for a multi-million-pound pilot scheme which embraced technological innovation and innovative mapping as a short-term solution to alleviate pressure on capacity.

This buys us some time to explore other collaborative funding options to meet the long-term wastewater needs of our region. Since the summer Newry Chamber has been engaging with our counterparts in Dundalk Chamber with a view to developing a regional cross-border socio-economic development project which will put the Newry-Dundalk hinterland at the centre of the Dublin Belfast Economic Corridor.

This has culminated in both chambers hosting a positive first meeting with Northern Ireland Water and Uisce Éireann Irish Water earlier in November with a view to developing a cross-border project which will put two new wastewater treatment

plants at the centre of the socio-economic development and environmental protection needs of our beautiful cross-border region.

We are in the early stages of this engagement but both water organisations have bought into the concept and will be engaging with each other over the coming months to shape the need of any ask from the NI Executive, Irish Government, UK Government and Europe. We expect to develop this project throughout 2026 to create a collaborative ask of Governments across these islands and in Brussels.

As we approach 2026, we all need to realise that Greater Newry has huge opportunities and we all need to collaborate with unity of purpose to seize those opportunities in the year ahead.

Newry Chamber has had a busy and successful year and many of the successful events, initiatives and engagements are captured in other sections of this 2025 Annual Report.

This AGM marks the end of our outgoing President Edwina Flynn's two-year term in office. To say that Edwina has brought energy and enthusiasm to the role is something of an understatement. She has been a remarkable President and advocate for this Chamber and businesses in Greater Newry, and I have thoroughly enjoyed working with her over the last two years.

As a networker and cheerleader for Greater Newry she has been as comfortable in her role in the halls of Capitol Hill in Washington and 10 Downing Street as in the Chamber Boardroom and opening Chamber events in the Canal Court Hotel. It has been a pleasure to work alongside Edwina over the last two years along with the Chamber Board and Chamber Team to transform the organisation and take it to a place where we believe it has a strong future. On behalf of the Chamber Team I would like to extend my sincere gratitude to Edwina for her dedication, commitment and determination over the last two years and wish her every success for the future in her role as CEO of Wood Innovations Ltd.

I would also like to thank the Chamber Board and Chamber Council for placing their faith in me and for providing a level of support and guidance that has been central to our success in 2025.

To our Corporate Patrons and Members, thank you for your unwavering support, attending and sponsoring events and contributing to initiatives that are shaping the economic future of our region. You and your businesses are what make our Chamber the success it is and I look forward to working closely with you again in 2026 as we open a new chapter on the Newry Chamber success story.

NEWRY CHAMBER WELCOMES WASTEWATER INNOVATION PILOT THAT RELEASES CAPACITY FOR DECADE OF DEVELOPMENT ACROSS THE CITY



Newry Chamber welcomed the news that Newry is to get a new innovative wastewater pilot scheme that will release urgently needed capacity to free up development across the city over the next 5-10 years.

Infrastructure Minister, Liz Kimmins MLA announced the scheme in July which represents potential investment by NI Water and the Department of up to £25 million.

Newry Chamber CEO, Michael Savage added:

"Over the last 18 months Newry Chamber has been lobbying hard to address the infrastructure deficit across our city, particularly across our wastewater treatment network. At least 29 major schemes have been in obedience due to lack of capacity in the system."

"This new innovative approach from NI Water and the Department can be a gamechanger for our region over the next decade, allowing construction to proceed while we all collaborate to find funding solutions for the major upgrade of the Newry Treatment Works."

"The Chamber has engaged with Minister Kimmins on this issue and from day one she has recognised the need for innovation in Newry and has worked with NI Water to deliver this pilot for our city."

"We commend Minister Kimmins for her swift action on this issue and thank NI Water for engaging with the Chamber and our members within this sector to find a solution that meets our needs over the next 5-10 years."

"Newry Chamber will be hosting a special Wastewater Seminar in September that will include a presentation from NI Water outlining how the pilot scheme provides much needed network capacity for development across our city and we will be encouraging developers and investors to attend this event. Details will be announced in the coming weeks."

"While this is welcome news for Newry, the need remains to carry out a major upgrade of the wastewater treatment plant at Greenbank and Newry Chamber will continue to lobby across these islands to find a funding solution that delivers the significant enhancements required to provide Newry with a 21st Century wastewater network."

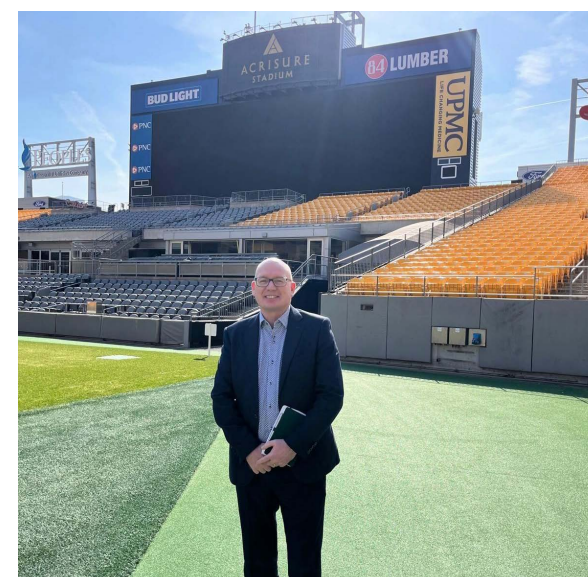
